[CRM_J 311](#) (now being added) – Research Methods for Criminal Justice. Introduces social science research methods, with an emphasis on applying them to criminology and criminal justice.

[ECONS 404](#) – Economics for Managers. Covers microeconomics for business decision-making, and a review of calculus.

[GEOLOGY 103](#) – Other Worlds: Comparative Planetology of our Solar System. The course starts with a history of spaceflight, then covers the origin of the universe, science on other planets, and the possibility of other solar systems and life on other worlds.

[HISTORY 120](#) (section 2) – World History I. Focuses on the interconnectedness of world societies since antiquity and how those ties have shaped our mutual histories.
